On a picture-perfect Friday night at Centerville Stadium, the Centerville Elks put on a stunning performance, overpowering the Northmont Thunderbolts 45-0 during their Homecoming game. The atmosphere was electric, with alumni and fans rallying behind their team as they battled for pride in this crucial GWOC conference matchup.

From the opening whistle, the Elks showcased an intensity that left their opponents reeling. Under the guidance of defensive coordinator, John Puckett, Centerville's defense was impenetrable, allowing Northmont to cross midfield only once, and that was late in the fourth quarter. Senior defensive co-captain Andrew Erwin, made a significant impact with a 21-yard interception, further stifling any hopes of a Thunderbolts comeback.

Offensively, Centerville was a well-oiled machine. Junior running back Parker Johnson had a standout night, rushing for three touchdowns, and bringing his season total to an impressive 14. He was supported by a formidable offensive line that paved the way for 211 rushing yards. Meanwhile, junior receiver Ryan Swanson had his best performance of the season, making five catches for 72 yards, including a 38-yard highlight reel grab that electrified the crowd.

Northmont's struggles were evident as quarterback Brady Lupton found himself scrambling for his life, taking three sacks throughout the game. The Thunderbolts managed just 100 total yards against a relentless Elk defense, struggling to find any rhythm.

The stat sheet reflected the game's lopsided nature: Centerville dominated with 20 first downs compared to Northmont's 7 and outgained them 337 yards to 100. With a 7-9 success rate on third downs, the Elks efficiently kept the chains moving.

As the final whistle blew, the score of 45-0 sealed a memorable Homecoming victory for the Elks, leaving fans hopeful for what lies ahead in the final games of the season. There is a strong possibility the boys will be rewarded with two home playoff games with their continued success. Elk Nation we need to see you in Springboro tonight to beat the Panthers!

# Inside the Headset



**Congratulations to the team on the Northmont victory, it appeared to be one of the best examples of complementary football all season. What did you see that lead up to such a solid performance?**

*That's an easy one to answer. We have been practicing well. There has been intentionality in our players at practice. There has been intentionality in what we are practicing. Even our scout teams have been doing a very good job leading up to the Northmont game and when you get good looks during the week, you're ready for Friday. Typically, at this part of the season, we shorten practice a little bit and try to lighten some of the physical reps that our guys get, in order to keep them fresh for Friday. It's been awesome to take a very business-like approach to it, handle practice changes with maturity, and not let there be any falloff in learning even though we have less time.*

**The Elks face another tough GWOC challenge this week at Springboro. The last ten matchups have resulted in five wins each, how did this become such a close rivalry?**

*Springboro always has very good players that play at a high level and they are coached by a great staff. You can tell in how they play. They play with great discipline and they limit mental mistakes. When you play good football with good football players, you get good football games. The conference overall has really elevated a lot in the past decade as well. Iron sharpens iron, and when the teams in our conference play each other, everyone knows you have to be at your best. The players in our conference take this sport very seriously and the coaches in our conference take this sport very seriously. I really believe that we have a special conference in the GWOC and it's incredible to be able to experience that each week.*

**With such a demanding schedule, what strategies do you use to ensure you're present and engaged in each aspect of your life, from home, to the classroom, the athletic department, to the football field ?**

*I'll have to admit that I'm always becoming and I've never arrived. I won't lie to you. I don't think I've figured it all out. I'll tell you this, that I have an incredible family. My wife, Sabar, is absolutely amazing. She's the rock and the glue for our family. She's always there for us and she keeps us together. She's an incredible mom and wife. I'm also incredibly fortunate to have some great in-laws in my corner. They help a ton with our family and our kids and free me up to do a lot of things. The only strategy I employ is that I try to steal inches with my family because they have to be my top priority. Whether that's stealing an hour for flag football game, a morning at church, or rushing home for dinner just to go back to work late at night, I try my best to make sure I'm stealing whatever inches I can with them. Another thing my wife and I have done is mandate that we average a least one date per month. It's been a great addition to our lives and even though it makes it a little busier, it's something that we look forward to. Personally, I believe in trying to work as hard as you can, but you have to keep your priorities and stealing inches with my family has been a really great strategy for me that helps keep me energized.*

**How do you recharge and take care of your own well-being amid the whirlwind of responsibilities?**

*Well, the date nights with my wife and the dinners with the kids really help. We get to sit down, talk, and do nothing else. It's great and really gets me going into the next task. Another thing that I think really helps is exercise. I used to think that I needed to rest my body because of the long hours we were working. It only left me tired and feeling worse. I've found that even getting some exercise 3-4 times per week really helps me feel great. Whether I can get it in before work or sneak it in during lunch, I always feel better after exercising and I'm sure I'm able to give a better product to our players and my family.*

**In nineteen days the community will vote on the Centerville School levy. If the levy does not pass, athletic teams and extra-curricular activities will be greatly impacted. What will be some of the measures the football program will implement to continue to field a team?**

*If this levy does not pass, athletic programs, like football, are going to feel changes immediately.*

- *First, we will lose contracts for coaches. Getting great coaches has always been something that Centerville has been able to do and with a reduced amount of contracts, it will be harder on football to keep as many great coaches around our players.*
- *Another thing that will change will be transportation. Each year we go away during the summer for camp and of course we also play away games each week whether it be varsity or JV. It will be very hard to get to those games without buses. Especially since there are many players on our team that do not drive.*
- *Lastly, and I personally think this is a big one, we will lose the ability to have B-games at the middle school level. It may not seem like a big deal to some, but let me tell you, it's a huge deal. Let me explain: B-games allow our middle school teams to carry more players because more players are getting game-reps when you can play two games per week rather than a single A-game each week. With more games, there are more players in the program, and the players have always been and will always be the lifeblood of the program. We have some incredible kids in Centerville and we need as many of those great kids playing football as possible. It's hard to keep kids interested in our sport if they aren't able to play because there only so many reps to go around a team in a game. I hope that makes sense, but either way, B-games are a big deal.*

*There will be many other changes that will affect football, and athletics in general, but those are what I believe are the big ones. Those are the things that could affect the quality of product we have in Centerville Football for many years to come.*

## Fairmont handles Springboro to keep a share of GWOC lead

KETTERING — Logan Doty scored two touchdowns as Fairmont beat Springboro 24-7 to hang onto a piece of first place in the GWOC.

Coach Dave Miller's Firebirds (6-2, 4-1) won it their way, grinding it out on offense and preventing the Panthers (5-3, 3-2) from making any big plays down the field.

"Call it what you want: It's kind of philosophical, we try to grind clock, though scoring on a pass play was big there to start off the game," Miller said. "But defensively we try to make them earn it. They're an explosive offense so we were trying to keep them to short passes and let them drive down the field."

Yeah, that's kind of how we like to do it, but really exceptional job tonight."

Fairmont mostly controlled the first half, scoring early by air and later by land to open up a 14-0 lead.

After both teams went three-and-out on their first possession, the Firebirds struck first when Brock Baker found Kameron Thornton streaking down the sideline for a 45-yard touchdown, his third touchdown catch of the season and Baker's fourth touchdown toss.

"Kam Thornton made a great play," Baker said. He had a step on the guy, and I kind of just handed it to him, and he's pretty fast. I just threw it up and he ran under it. So it's a great play by Kam, and we're hoping to get more of those."

Max Gehring's PAT kick made it 7-0 Fairmont with 6:45 left in the first quarter.

After forcing a punt, the Firebirds got the ball back at their 14-yard line and went on a more Fairmont-like march, using 13 plays to cover 86 yards and get seven more points.

Logan Doty completed it with a 1-yard run, and Gehring made it 14-0 with 9:00 left in the second quarter before Springboro mounted its best drive of the half.

Utilizing the quick passing game, the Panthers moved to the Fairmont 21 with under 30 seconds left, but they had to settle for a 38-yard field goal attempt.

When that went wide left, the Panthers went to the locker room trailing 14-0, but Springboro picked up where it left off in the second half, taking the opening kickoff of the third quarter and driving 80 yards for a touchdown.

The drive started inauspiciously when Logan Wilkins threw Drew Balogh for a 2-yard loss on first down, but the Panthers recovered with an 18-yard pass from Max Miller to Jaxon Long to convert a third down.

That got them rolling on what would be a 17-play march that took nearly eight minutes off the clock and concluded with Miller finding Brayden Wilhite wide open on a play-action rollout for a 4-yard touchdown.

Miller was 26-of-38 for 188 yards. Long caught 15 passes for 102 yards.

Fairmont struck right back with its own 80-yard touchdown drive, this one punctuated by Doty's 48-yard run on the final play of the third quarter. With the Firebirds facing a fourth-and-less-than-1, they lined up in a triple I and gave the ball to Doty, who went right up the middle, picked up a lead block and then sprinted untouched after breaking through the line. He finished with 127 yards and two TDs on 23 carries.

Springboro looked like it had something going on its ensuing possession until Wilkins threw Miller for a 12-yard loss on a sack. Miller scrambled to get the Panthers to a fourth-and-10, but his pass over the middle was intercepted by linebacker Kolby Wallace to end the drive. Fairmont tacked on three more after that when Gehring made a 29-yard field goal with 4:25 to go.

"They've got a young quarterback who's gonna be really good — already is — so getting pressure on him like that makes it tough," Miller said. "I played quarterback a long time ago, and when you can't get your feet set and throw, that's a big difference. So Wilkins has some speed, (Konor) Haston over there on the other side, they do a good job with that. And the guys the interior did it all night, too. So good stuff."

Fairmont, Springboro, Centerville and Springfield all entered the night

for first place in the league with 3-1 league records.

While the Firebirds were downing the Panthers, Centerville and Springfield were winning big.

The Elks downed Northmont 45-0 while the Wildcats crushed Beaver Creek 60-8.

Springboro hosts Centerville next week while Fairmont will have another battle for first place on its hands when the Firebirds go to Springfield.

"Pretty exciting," Miller said. "It's what you want this time of year, to be going into Week 9 and playing for a championship. So, it's pretty cool. Credit to our kids."

"This is one of the most process-oriented teams I've ever been a part of, and they just come back to work, and hopefully that's what we keep doing. We can't get ahead of ourselves. So as long as they stick to the process and keep doing that, you know, we should be in pretty good shape."

Wilkins, who has 11.5 tackles for loss including six sacks on the season, called being in the hunt for a conference title this late in the season "surreal."

"It's special," the senior said. "It's definitely special. But again, we come in, we're all about the process. So I'm happy, but at the same time, every single day, we all come in as a team, we all work. We all put in the work."

"So, I'm not necessarily thinking, 'We gotta win the GWOC,' but I'm thinking, 'We put in all the work so we can't lose.'"

Things didn't go as planned for Springboro last fall. A 2-9 finish was not the way things should have ended. Now, the Panthers are looking to rebound and make the playoffs for a school record sixth straight time.

"We had a great season in 2022, but alot of injuries and problems with turnovers led to a disappointing season in 2023. This team is looking to get things right. The effort and attitudes have been excellent this offseason. It's a complete page turn from last year and there appears to be no lasting effects from struggles of last year," head coach Ryan Wilhite states.

The positivity is a huge plus but Wilhite knows his team still has to execute on both sides of the ball. "We have alot of experience on offense and return three linemen. If our o-line can protect our young quarterbacks while they grow up and we can establish a running game to take pressure off of them, this offense has a chance to be much improved from last season."

Wilhite goes on. "Defensively we lost a ton from last year. This unit will be tested but we appear to be solid at a lot of positions. We are a senior heavy along the defensive line but with not much experience. This group could go from a weakness to a strength, though. They are very hard working, blue collar. We will have a team effort approach with relentless effort and pursuit to the football."

Last season was an aberration. It was the program's first losing campaign since 2011. Look for Springboro to bounce back and finish on the winning side of the ledger.

## OTHER RETURNEES

**Brayden Wilhite**, Sr, WR – Will be one of the focal points of the offense after a breakout junior campaign. Wilhite had 31 receptions, 321 yards receiving and two touchdowns a year ago.

**Braylen Smith**, Sr, TE – Will be the Panthers starter at tight end. Smith is still looking for his first varsity reception.

**Jackson Dulle**, Sr, OL – A returning starter up front, Dulle will be called upon to provide senior leadership on the o-line.

**Joseph Schenking**, Sr, OL – Like Dulle the coaching staff will look to Schenking to be a leader in the trenches.

**Jack Harper**, Jr, OL – One of the teams most pleasant surprises in 2023. Harper graded out as the Panthers top offensive lineman. He will move from right tackle to left tackle.

**Mattias Brunicardi**, Jr, RB – The staff is excited to see what Brunicardi can do. In Week 8 at last fall against Wayne, he ran for 171 of his 256 yards and his only touchdown on the season.

**Jaxon Long**, Jr, WR/DB – Will team with Wilhite to give the Panthers a potent punch at receiver. Long caught balls for 227 yards. He also had 13 total tackles as a sophomore.

Senior OLB **Jake Cane**, juniors OLB **Evan Weinberg**, DB **Drew Balogh** as well as sophomores QB **Aidan Newdigate** and QB **Max Miller** are all battling for spots in the rotation and starting roles. Miller and Newdigate are in a tight race for the quarterback job.
